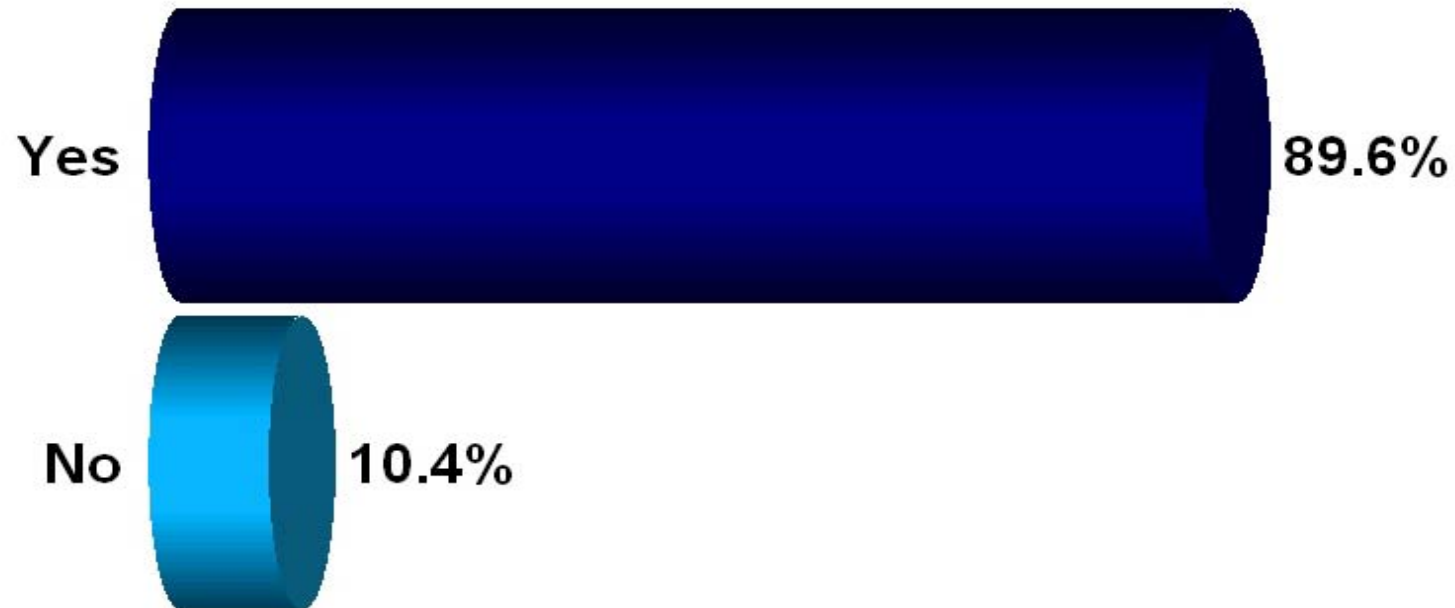
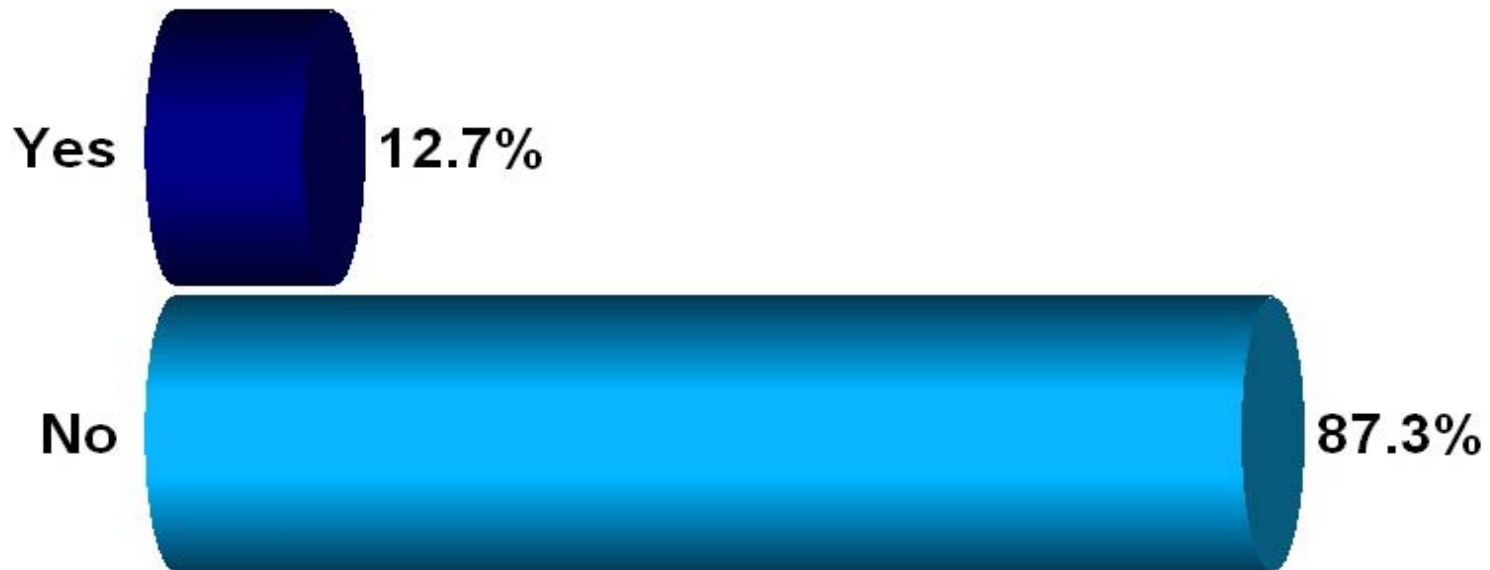


Do you think EHRs are going to revolutionize the healthcare system?



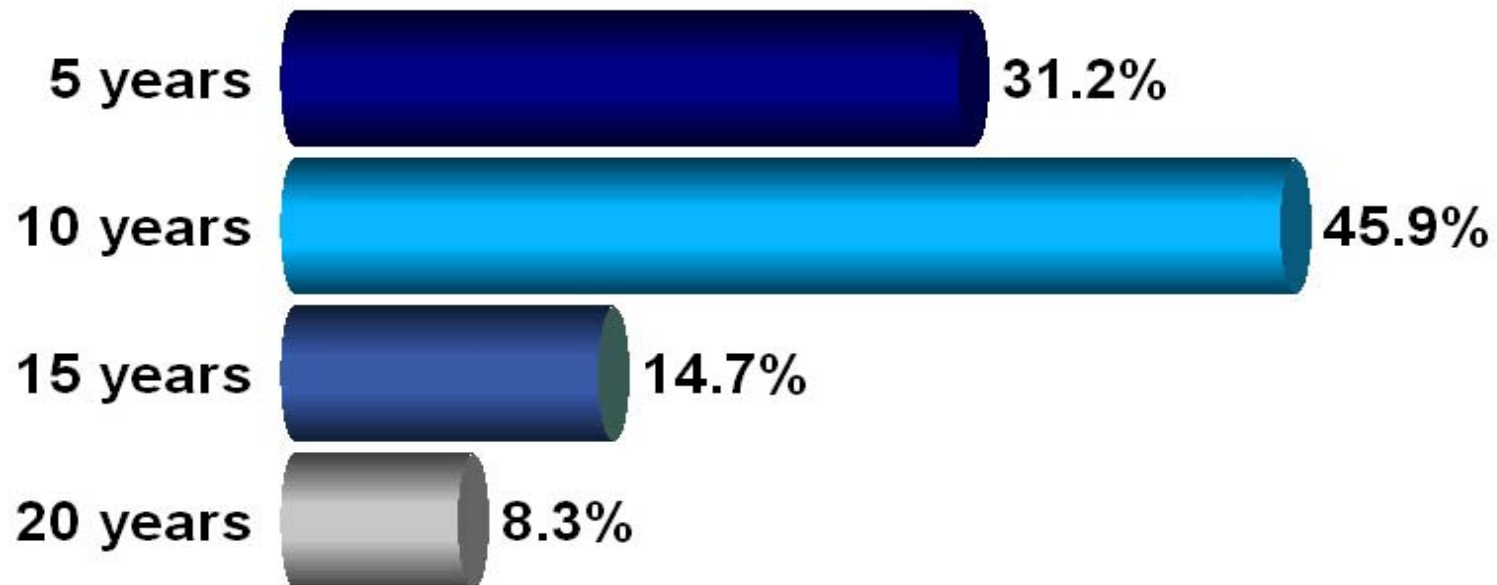
Do you think government-run EHRs are the answer?



If a hospital has an EHR system in place, would a patient be more or less likely to want to visit that hospital?

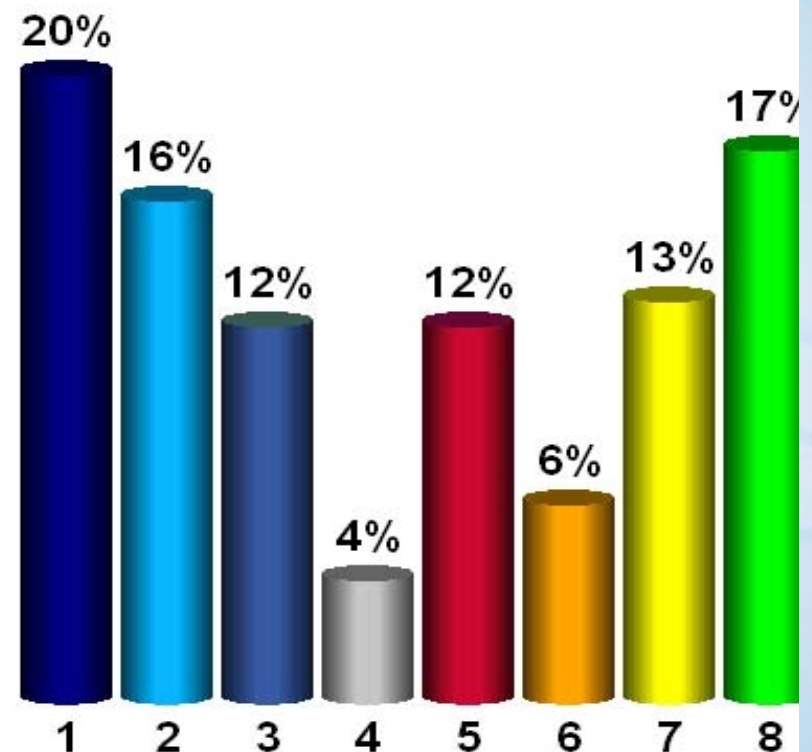


How long before EHRs are used in the majority of U.S. hospitals?
